

November Statistics

In the month of November 2014, the Seneca Falls Police Department handled 628 calls for service. Of these 628 calls for service, 45 resulted in criminal arrests. The Seneca Falls Police Department responded to 40 traffic accidents. SFPD also conducted 304 traffic stops for the month of November with 120 traffic tickets issued and 2 Driving While Intoxicated arrests.

In comparing November 2013 to November of 2014, calls for service were up 4% (602/628); criminal arrests were up 28% (35/45); traffic arrests were up 10% (109/120); traffic accidents were down 9% (44/40); and Driving While Intoxicated arrests were equal (2/2).

The Seneca Falls Police Department was assisted by outside law enforcement agencies on 31 calls for service and assisted other outside law enforcement agencies on 12 calls for service in the month of November 2014.



Criminal Investigation Division

During November of 2014 the Criminal Investigation Division of the Seneca Falls Police Department arrested (2) individuals on a total of (2) felony charges and (1) misdemeanor charge. This closed (2) CID cases by arrest.

CID was assigned or assisted with (20) new cases in November of 2014. (6) of these cases are already closed by arrest or some other form of closure or clearance. (1) of the closed cases involved the execution of a search warrant by members of the Seneca County Sheriff's Department and Seneca Falls Police Department on a town residence. This search warrant resulted in numerous drug related charges being filed on (2) individuals.

CID worked jointly with Seneca County Division of Human Services on a few child abuse cases in November of 2014.

The most significant case for CID in November was the Criminal Mischief at Lakeside Trading where several thousands of dollars in property damage occurred.

Training

In November 2014, all Sergeants and Road Patrol were trained in the Use of Narcan. The training was provided by Megan Peters from Seneca County Public Health and was held at the Seneca Falls Police Dept. All Sergeants and Road Patrol now carry a Narcan kit to be used for a heroin overdose.

PTO Roller Skating Party for Cady Stanton
